General Information:

It is official, we are opening up 2 new classrooms for the 2018-2019 school year! The additions will help us to accommodate all our current families. It's possible we will have 2 Pre-K classes next year. I will know for certain once registration week is over.

The new modular building will resemble our current buildings architect and will sit on a foundation. The placement of the building will be in the gravel parking lot parallel with the toy shed. This building will also include a badly needed storage room. Each classroom will come with a bathroom and teacher sink and counter space. When the time comes we will also extend the fence to surround the building.

Once construction begins, teachers will park in the Kleberg parking lot, so parents have more available parking when dropping off and picking up your children.

This is an exciting time for our school and the church parish has supported our vision and given their blessings for us to move forward. When asked if we plan to expand even further, the answer has been "no." We like the idea of having 2 extra classrooms, so we can keep our teacher/child ratios low, but still be considered a small to medium size school.

Registration (Summer and Fall)

To register for fall, you only need the application and enrollment fee turned in at your specified time.
